## Medford, Oregon – School District #49 – 549C

1883	First school in Medford (one room wooden building on S. Central, just south of the Montgomery Wards store, now Rogue Community College, 117 S. Central. Subscription school charging \$8 per student for each year, Mr. Williamson was the teacher.
1884	Formation of Medford School District #49 on February 20, 1884, created from a division of District 2. Mr. Wm M. Colvig was County Superintendent. During the summer of 1884 the first school house, a white, framed structure of two stories was constructed. Will Gore, a well-known Jackson County pioneer, was the first principal and served from 1884-1886. A school house, West School, was built on W. Main, between Oakdale Ave. & Laurel St. School building was moved in 1891 to West Tenth Street, behind the Catholic Church and became a private residence. A replacement building was built in 1891, providing a bit more room, and housed at least three years of high school. In 1895-1896 school year, the structure burned and the final term was completed by rentals of churches and a downtown hall, two of which had successive fires causing brick to become a popular material in the building of new public facilities, as had already been learned in Jacksonville. Property sold to county for courthouse, 10 S. Oakdale Ave. A brick school building called the Washington School was built on the Main and Laurel location and was dedicated, March 3, 1896. 1885	Medford (City of) incorporated
1891	Oak Grove Elementary, 2838 Jacksonville Hwy., built. Consolidated with Medford, 1956-57.
1893	First high school graduation exercises – May 19, 1893.
1902	Griffin Creek Elementary, 2430 Griffin Creek Rd, built.
1906	North School constructed (now known as Lincoln Elementary).
1907-08	Medford Public Schools became first class district during the school year.
1909	A high school building was erected on Bartlett between 5 <sup>th</sup> & 6 <sup>th</sup> Streets, West Side School, 3070 Ross Lane, built. Currently leased to Naval Reserve.
1910	School district population – 1682 students. Per Mail Tribune Dec.1, 2010, Mail Tribune 100 year Column: Dec. 1, 1910 - The population of Medford, Oregon, was announced today by the census bureau as 8,840, an increase from 1,791 in 1900, or 392 percent. This percentage of growth is the greatest made by any town in the United States, with the exception of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, which shows a percent increase of 396. The twelfth census gave Medford a population of 1,791 and the eleventh 967.
1911	Fall opening of Roosevelt and Jackson Elementary Schools.
1912	Old Howard Elementary, 285 Mace Rd and 2801 Merriman address built. School converted to Grounds/Facilities, IMC, and NTS departments. First in-service training program initiated
1913	Ruch Elementary, 156 Upper Applegate Rd, built. Consolidated with Medford in 1959.
1925	E.H. Hedrick assumed superintendency – retired 1955.
1926	New Medford Senior High School, 320 W. 2 <sup>nd</sup> St., constructed (presently McLoughlin Middle School). Lone Pine Elementary, 3158 Lone Pine Road, opened.
1931	Washington Elementary School, 610 S. Peach St. opened. Medford High School, 815 S. Oakdale Ave, opened (South Medford High School – 2005).
1952	Administration moved from City Hill, 201 N. Central Ave. to Central Office Administration Building, 500 Monroe St.
1954	Jacksonville Elementary, 655 Hueners Lane, opened.

1955	Dr. Leonard B. Mayfield assumed superintendence on retirement of E.H. Hedrick. Dr. Mayfield served as assistant superintendent for one year prior to assuming the superintendence – Dr. Mayfield died April 23, 1965. Hedrick Jr. High School, 1501 E. Jackson St., opened. Jefferson Elementary, 333 Holmes Ave., opened.
1956	West Side School District #95, Oak Grove S.D. #69, consolidation April 9, 1956 ; Dewey District #29 and Kenwood District #102 , consolidation with Medford Schools June 30, 1956. July 1, 1956 Medford School District #49 changed to Medford School District 549C.
1958	Hoover Elementary, 2323 Siskiyou Blvd, dedicated January 20, 1959, Roy Gilbertson, principal. Wilson Elementary, 1400 Johnson St., opened.
1959	Construction of District Warehouse, 750 N. Columbus Ave. Jacksonville, Griffin Creek, Ruch, Lone Pine, and Howard Schools consolidation, April 16, 1959. The change of district 49 to 549C stands for 5 schools and the C for consolidation, changing it from #49 to 549C.
1965	Dr. Elliott D. Becken assumed superintendency on death of Dr. Mayfield, serving as superintendent until July, 1968. Dr. E.D. Becken moved to Tucson, Arizona and became superintendent of Amphitheater District.
1967	New Medford Senior High School, presently North Medford High School (1900 North Keene Way Dr). Dedicated April 28, 1968. Bill Ruck principal. 6-2-2 plan put into operation during 1967-68 school year.
1968	Dr. Richard Langton replaced Dr. Becken as superintendent
1969	Lincoln Elementary on Bartlett St. closed.
1972-83	Howard Elementary started building in 1972 with 9 classrooms and a gymnasium. 1983 main building officially opened.
1975	Central Office Annex, 600 Whitman Place acquired. This was an apartment building that retired teachers lived in. Address was 600, 602, 604, 606, 608, 610, 612 and 614 Whitman Place. Changed to 600 Whitman Place only. Plan drawn up by Donald P. Rounds for converting apartments to original use on 8-16-75. Remodel was done in 1976.
1977-82	Kennedy Elementary, 2860 N. Keene Way Drive, opened. Kennedy was built in phases.
1979	Property on corner of Columbus Ave. and Cunningham acquired from Frank G. and Annita Dancer.
1986	September 1986 – 2 four year high schools formed. North Medford High School, 1900 N. Keene Way Dr., and South Medford High School, 815 S. Oakdale Ave.
1997	New Abraham Lincoln Elementary, 3101 McLoughlin Dr., Medford 97504, opened.
2006	School bond passes in November. The Medford School District with about 12,500 pupils asked voters for a \$189 million bond issue. The measure includes replacing South Medford High and Lone Pine Elementary, remodeling North Medford High and Jackson, Oak Grove, Roosevelt and Washington elementary schools and making repairs and improvements such as air-conditioning and asbestos removal to 11 other campuses.
2007	Jackson and Roosevelt temporarily closed due to safety issues of brick buildings. Starting September 2007 children will be housed at different schools.
2009	December 2009 Jackson and Roosevelt schools completed and the move back to the new schools. Same sites, but different addresses due to the fact that the front doors face a different street.
2010	New South Medford High School, 1551 Cunningham Ave., Medford, opened. September 2010
2010	Central Medford High School (former MOHS) moves to 815 S. Oakdale Ave., Medford 97501, September 2010
2011	Central office moved to the old SMHS, 815 S. Oakdale Ave in August. The building will house Central Medford High School, Central office, 500 Monroe St.
